

Singapore Country Code (BBHQ)

As Singapore is highly urbanised, the Country Code has been revised to reflect the local environment.

1. Guard against all risk of fire.
 - a. Do not light up a fire at unauthorised areas.
 - b. Barbecues should be held at designated barbecue pits.
 - c. Do not leave fire unattended.
 - d. Remove flammable material from the proximity of the barbecue pit or camp fire.
 - e. Never burn plastics or other toxic materials in campfires or barbecues.
 - f. The barbecue fire or campfire should be doused properly prior to leaving the area.
2. Leave no litter.
 - a. Practise proper disposal of unwanted items.
 - b. Take out some litter and leave the place cleaner than when you find it.
3. Protect wildlife, plants and trees.
 - a. Do not damage the habitat.
 - b. Do not pick or remove any vegetation or wildlife.
 - c. Do not disturb wildlife.
 - d. Do not feed wildlife. Take care not to expose food or drinks in the presence of wildlife, for example, monkeys.
 - e. Do not release animals into the wild.
4. Care for Singapore's water resources by keeping waters in the reservoirs and catchment areas clean.
5. Keep noise to the minimal.
6. Walk, cycle and skate on designated tracks only.
